The American Spine Registry (ASR) launched in January 2020 with two modules: Degenerative Lumbar Spine and Degenerative Cervical Spine. This report provides a preview of the data in the ASR.

ASR, a partnership between the American Association of Neurological Surgeons (AANS) and the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS), represents a collaboration to enhance and improve the quality of spine care by providing spine surgeons access to a national data-collection program. Thank you to the ASR Executive Committee and ASR Data Use Committee for their contributions and leadership in bringing this registry report to fruition.



Figure 1 Cervical Rates of Reported Diagnoses (N=55,504)*




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Figure 2 Lumbar Rates of Reported Diagnoses (N=109,614)*

Figure 3 ASR Rates of Reported Procedure Types (Cervical N = 55,504; Lumbar N = 109,614)*







Figure 7 Cervical Inpatient and Outpatient Procedure Cases (Cervical N = 55,254)




Figure 8 Lumbar Inpatient and Outpatient Procedure Cases (Lumbar N=105,733)
